PPLC Bed Campaign

Thanks to many gifts from individuals and businesses, Prospect Park Living Center was able to purchase the 35 new beds needed for their residents. Your donations helped the Foundation raise the entire \$75,000 needed for this improvement. In addition to providing comfort and support to those who spend much time in bed, the modern technology of these new beds provides extra safety. Staff can now better maneuver and assist those in their care. Most importantly, our PPLC residents will now rest more comfortably, improving their overall quality of life.

Amount of Uncompensated Care \$7,940,000








