From the Executive Director

It hardly seems possible that 6 months have elapsed since I was appointed Executive Director of the EPMC Foundation. The time has flown by, due in part to the many projects that we have recently undertaken. We refer to EPMC as a 'small hospital,' but you can believe that big things are happening here.

Much work has been done on the Wellness Center campaign. A cross-functional team of business leaders, EPMC Foundation Board Members, Park Hospital District Board Members, and community volunteers formed a Steering Committee this past winter and started raising money for the project. Significant work has been done, and more than 20 gifts have been procured from individuals, foundations and businesses. You can read about the Wellness Center at epwell**nesscenter.org**. Alongside the Wellness Center campaign, we are raising money to purchase and install an Infant Security System in the New Life Center.

This project will help ensure that newborn babies and their parents will be able to spend those first critical days bonding in a safe and secure environment. This \$120,000 campaign is still in need of partners - visit GivetoEPMC.org for more information and to get involved.

Recently, the Foundation received over \$60,000 to purchase new beds for the Med/Surg Unit at the hospital (inpatient care). These state-of-theart beds will provide a more comfortable stay for patients, as well as enhance safety for nursing staff members.

Although a lot has happened this year, there is still much work to be done. I look forward to the opportunity to meet you, our faithful donors, to thank you for your partnership that enables The Foundation to support the hospital and help ensure quality care for all in the Estes Valley.

Last summer, resident Glen Johnson was admitted to Estes Park Medical Center. After a long struggle with his health, he went into Hospice care and eventually passed away at home. During his hospitalization on the medical surgical unit, he received exceptional, compassionate care. His dying wish was to use the monies he had set aside to purchase new hospital beds so that all patients could be as comfortable and cared for as he was. His long-time friend made that wish a reality this summer.

Seven Stryker hospital beds were delivered at the end of July and were moved into the medical-surgical unit patient rooms. "We are honored that Glen chose to provide new state-of-the art beds for our patient rooms," said Erin Wooley, RN, BSN, Director of the Medical Surgical Unit. "These beds include bed scales which can weigh the patient without moving them. Additionally the beds are adjustable and come equipped with a nurse call system. My staff is grateful for the donation as this will assist us in providing even safer, more efficient care."

A dedication was held on August 9th where friends and staff gathered to remember Glen. A plaque in his memory has been hung in the room he occupied. A portion of the old beds were moved to Prospect

Efforts Continue on Upgrading Newborn Safety and Security

Donations are currently being sought to replace the existing infant security system in the New Life Center at Estes Park Medical Center. The fundraising goal for the new security system is \$100,000.

The number of births each year in the New Life Center has been increasing. In 2015, there were 94 babies welcomed into the world at EPMC, compared to 76 births in 2014. This growing need in our community deserves the quality of care and a level of security that rivals the region's largest birthing centers. Systems like the one to be installed at EPMC employ the latest technology to secure designated areas. Any unauthorized attempt to leave a monitored area triggers an alarm and activates door locks to prevent exiting. These systems, along with other safety protocols, let new parents and staff focus worry-free on caring for the newborn and the joys of family life.




