Prospect Park Living Center: Care with Dignity

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Prospect Park Living Center (PPLC) is an award-winning skilled nursing facility adjacent to Estes Park Medical Center, situated in a beautiful mountain setting. PPLC is separately licensed with the state of Colorado for 52 beds; we are a freestanding independent skilled nursing facility. We consider the individuals who live in PPLC to be "residents" – not patients, as this is their home; every day our staff is dedicated to providing a home like setting with compassion and comfort and lots of fun!

In PPLC we provide multiple services for our residents including 24 hour intermediate, skilled healthcare, hospice, and respite care. PPLC provides semi-private and private rooms, physical therapy, occupational therapy and speech therapy. PPLC also provides satellite TV in every room, a wheelchair accessible van, and outdoor patio and music therapy. We have an active restorative program for our residents that promotes the residents' ability to adapt and adjust to living as independently and safely as possible; we focus on achieving and maintaining optimal physical, mental, and psychosocial functioning. PPLC provides resident activities within the facility and we also provide excursions to different venues. Last year the residents went to the Butterfly Pavilion, the Central City Casinos, Hammond's Chocolate Factory, and Walmart, to name a few. As well we provide transportation locally to and from various appointments. PPLC provides onsite hair stylist /barber services for a nominal cost to the resident.

At PPLC we have a team of caregivers, Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, Certified Nurse's Aides, and physicians, supported by skilled professionals in environmental services and dietary, that ensures that our residents receive the highest standards of service, safety and quality on a daily basis. As a result of this dedicated team of professionals PPLC has been awarded the following recognitions:

Presently PPLC is working on various improvements to enhance quality and comfort for our residents and their loved ones. Thanks to generous support from the Estes Park Medical Center Foundation we will be:

- Replacing 35 of the residents' beds in February of 2018 with wider and longer beds and mattresses that flip for soft or firm surfaces
- Adding a couch and loveseat and coffee table in the activities room to provide a more home like setting
- Upgrading the dining room with new furniture, dishes and a buffet style service so residents can see, smell and choose their food from a selection of entrees; "dining must be a personal and welcoming experience and classy for our residents"
- Creating a "living room" for the residents and their loved ones to provide a quiet sanctuary for reading, quiet time, and family gatherings

Additionally, a new "state of the art" elder-friendly physician exam room within PPLC opened in the summer for the PPLC residents.

PPLC is proud to be an award winning skilled nursing facility. All of the staff in PPLC are proud of the care that we provide to our residents and their families in Estes Park. Many of the facilities in the valley seek out PPLC for individuals needing a skilled nursing facility because we truly are a place where we live our mission of making a positive difference in the health and wellbeing of all of our residents.

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Marty Yochum-Casey

Thirty-year Estes Park resident Marty Yochum-Casey, who suffers from Parkinson's Disease, had been going to Longmont for medical care. In June of last year, she fell in her kitchen and her husband and grandson called the ambulance to get her to the EPMC Emergency Department.

Dr. Chris Daley was the attending physician and summoned orthopedist Dr. Michael Grant right away. Marty had broken her femur just below the hip joint but, luckily, it was a clean break and the hip was fine. She was taken into surgery immediately, assured by Dr. Grant that she would be as good as new the next day.

"When I came out of surgery my husband's bed was being made up for him in my room by a kind nursing assistant," Marty shared. "Dr. Grant was there and every single thing he told me and my husband from before the surgery until we left the hospital a week later was absolutely true and my progress was exactly as he said it would be. He engenders the kindness, gentleness, and professionalism that patients long for in our medical practitioners. But I cannot thank Dr. Grant for his wonderful surgical skills and sunny personality without mentioning the emergency and x-ray techs, nurses, nursing assistants, physical therapists and patient care specialists as well as my many friends and visitors.

Working together, they kept me busy, happy, and focused continually on how well I was doing! I credit my smooth recovery to the wonderful care I received." In comparing her experience at the hospital in Longmont the previous fall for back surgery, Marty stated, "While the care I received at Longmont was kind and professional, it was not provided with the same sense of everyone working together as a team focused solely on my getting better so I could go home and WALK. EPMC has GREAT DOCTORS! The nurses are more unhurried and willing to see to your needs than any other place I have been. I never once asked for help

that someone didn't come to be there for me at once. I would emphasize to anyone who is seeking quality care and needing to undergo a procedure that requires hospitalization, you could not do better than having the Estes Park Medical Center care for you! I would consider us all more than lucky to have this very professional but small facility here."
