#### Selected Accomplishments:

- Completed business plan and secured financial resources through philanthropic means to purchase \$1.5 million *da Vinci*® and build first robotic surgical services program in northern Wisconsin.
- Through a collaborative effort, implemented a significant financial recovery for HYHC improving our position from an \$8 million deficit in fiscal year 2008 to a breakeven in fiscal years 2009 and 2010 despite national economic down turn, reductions in government reimbursements and a 10% increase in government payers. Progressive operating margin gains for next three fiscal years.
