- Family Medicine Dr. Paige Dekker, MD Family Medicine has started employment and is available to see patients on Monday, Thursday & Friday.
- Chemotherapy Update: UCHealth's leadership has been on site and worked with staff and provided staff training regarding chemo delivery services. Overall, the program has been readied to start accepting patients and serving the community. First patient expected 7/28/2022.
- Radiology Update: As a reminder, Colorado Imaging Associates (CIA) will be discontinuing their after-hours tele-radiology service September 1, 2022. EPH has arranged tele-radiology coverage with Radiology Imaging Associates. Credentialing, electronic networking, etc. are on track to establish this service by September 1, 2022.

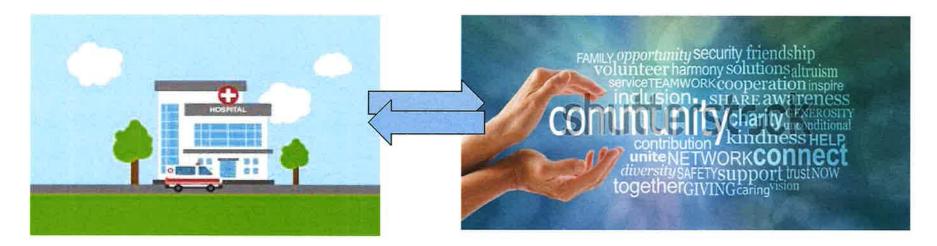

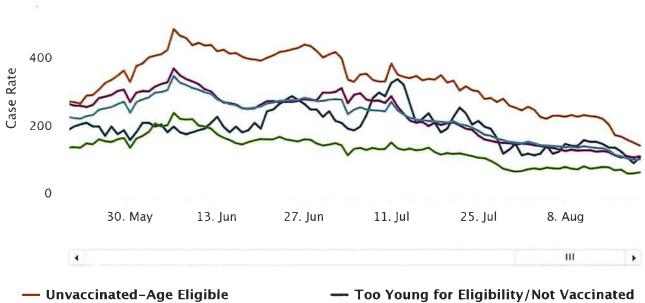

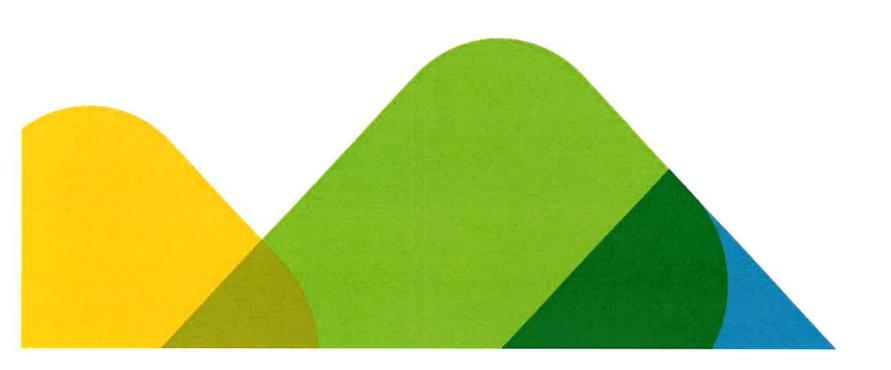

## **Medical Staff Updates:**

- Planning project management team for service line changes
- Successful transition in group providing EPH after hours/weekend radiology coverage
- PPEC
  - Systematic process to review cases/concerns
- Outpatient
  - COVID Vaccinations- Moderna vaccine available for 6 months and older
    - Children 6 months to 5 years- primary series (4-8 weeks apart)
    - Children 6-11 years- primary series (4-8 weeks apart), no booster recommended yet
    - Adolescents 12-17 years- Primary series (4 weeks), no booster
    - Adults- Primary series (4 weeks), Third dose for immunocompromised (28 days after 2<sup>nd</sup> dose), Booster one- at least 5 months from last dose primary series, Booster two- (>50 years old or >12 with immunocompromising conditions)- at least 4 months from first booster
    - Pfizer (booster recommended for children 6-11 and 12-17/adults)
    - Both Moderna and Pfizer seeking FDA authorization for updated vaccine



## **Medical Staff Updates:**

- Quality/Inpatient
  - Ongoing efforts for quality related projects and standardization of care
- Infection Prevention
  - Monkey Pox education, Refer to health department for vaccinations/concerns
  - No changes currently from hospital standpoint regarding COVID
- Pediatrics
  - Pediatric admissions continue to be on case-by-case basis
- Surgery
  - Working to define pediatric surgery guidelines
- ED/Urgent Care
  - High summer volumes, with significant jump in urgent care volumes compared to last summer
