Estes Park Health Foundation raised over \$545K of the \$1.1 million needed to bring a new MRI machine to Estes Park.


Installed in May 2022, the new state-of-the art Siemens Altea wide bore 1.5T MRI technology transforms patient care by providing consistent, superior image quality and reduced scan times by up to 50%. The new MRI machine increases patient comfort and patient satisfaction during MRI scans due to the wider bore and reduced noise. With the new machine in place, we have less unit downtime and increased performance.


2021 Chairman of the Board, Estes Park Health Foundation

Foundation Supporters, Board, and Staff have always been driven by community and 2021 was no different. In addition to the over \$545k raised to help fund a new MRI machine at Estes Park Health, the Foundation approved \$200,135 last year to upgrade equipment and support Estes Park Health patients and staff. EPH Departments that received grant funding include Ambulance, Diagnostic Imaging, Emergency Medical Services, Laboratory, Materials Management Med/Surg, Pediatrics, Pharmacy, Rehab, and Wound Care. \$62,854 of the above funds went directly to support COVID-19 testing, prevention, and treatment for uninsured residents of the Estes Valley.

COLORADO GIVES DAY RECAP

In December of 2021, the Foundation participated in Colorado Gives Day, a statewide day of giving. Donors who give on Colorado Gives Day take advantage of a \$1.6 million incentive fund that increases the value of every donation.

ESTES PARK HEALTH FOUNDATION FUNDS NEW MRI MACHINE FOR ESTES PARK HEALTH

In 2021, the Foundation Board & Staff focused on raising funds to bring a new MRI machine to Estes Park Health. Due to generous support of individuals, organizations, and businesses, Estes Park Health Foundation raised over \$545k to help fund this equipment, and the **new MRI machine** was installed in May of 2022.

The new MRI machine, a Siemens Magnetom Altea 1.5T, has many benefits including:

- Shorter scan times; reduced exam times by 50%
- Diagnostically superior images
- Better patient comfort with 4 inches more space in the machine



- Adjustable exam coil for exceptional patient positioning
- Prostate exams don't require the use of a rectal coil
- Quiet Suite Technology reduces noise during exams

EPH is the only MRI provider in the Estes Valley. The old machine was 14 years old. Due to its age, the previous MRI machine experienced significant downtime and parts to repair it were difficult to find.

PAINT ESTES PINK 2021

Paint Estes Pink is a weeklong initiative put forth by Estes Park Health Foundation to raise money for cancer services at Estes Park Health. The week culminates in Pink Night at the Rooftop Rodeo where Paint Estes Pink Competition Winners are announced.

In its 8th year, Paint Estes Pink raised funds to purchase a new MRI machine at Estes Park Health. MRIs are often used to diagnose certain types of cancer and to see if cancer has spread to other parts of the body.

Five women competed in the Crowns for the Care Competition in 2021: Melissa Addison, Dona Cooper, Lisa Hohensee, Sonja McTeague, and Stacey Tabor. These local volunteers raised \$26,870 as a group with Cooper winning the Mrs. Rooftop Rodeo crown by contributing over \$19k in donations, a new record.

Water Wheel Gift Corner won the Business Fundraising Competition, and Bank of Estes Park won the Best Decorated Business Competition. The Foundation is grateful for everyone that participated in Paint Estes Pink including the mentorship of the Past Mrs. Rooftop Rodeo Queens and volunteer hours of the Estes Park Mountain Bike Team. Sponsorship from the Rooftop Rodeo, Estes Park Trail-Gazette, and Estes Park News helped make this year a success.

"Support from Estes Park Health Foundation funded a Newborn Anne Mannequin and a Pediatric Vision Screener for EPH Pediatrics. The Newborn Anne Mannequin is used for Neonatal Resuscitation training. The mannequin's airway allows for all aspects of training in newborn airway management and is an essential tool for staff training. The Pediatric Vision Screener tests the vision of children as young as 6 months for problems like farsightedness, nearsightedness, blurred vision, unequal refractive power, eye alignment, and unequal pupil size. Use

of a vision screener is ideal for early intervention programs targeted at special needs, preverbal, and preschool children. Thank you EPHF donors!
