



## **EPH Foundation Speaker Bureau**



As with the rest of the healthcare industry across the nation, Estes Park Health has faced significant challenges over the last several years. It's a challenge for small rural hospitals like Estes Park Health to provide high quality healthcare on a sustainable basis and invest capital in the technology needed to stay abreast of the industry. Estes Park Health is not alone in this struggle; the healthcare industry as a whole is consolidating in response.

While continuing to provide quality, compassionate health-care, a viable option is for Estes Park Health to affiliate with a larger health system. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, the Estes Park Health Foundation will continue serving the community health needs in the Estes Valley, regardless of any affiliation created by Estes Park Health and a larger health system.

When a large health system affiliates with a community-owned medical center like Estes Park Health, the large health system



often invests monetary support to both the medical center and the supporting foundation. For example, Yampa Valley Medical Center affiliated with UCHealth in 2017. As part of that affiliation, UCHealth agreed to donate \$20 million to Yampa Valley Medical Center Foundation over seven years.

#### Crowns for the Care Funds Expansion & Upgrades for Estes Park Health Outpatient Infusion Clinic

Five women competed in the Crowns for the Care Competition last summer: Joy Gimar, Bethany Heun, Lesta Johnson, Emily Rayman, and Jenny Roberts, to support oncology services at Estes Park Health and compete for the title of Mrs. Rooftop Rodeo. They raised \$47,845 as a group with Lesta Johnson winning the Mrs. Rooftop Rodeo crown by raising almost \$15,000 in donations. Since its inception in 2017, Crowns for the Care has raised \$189,308 to support cancer care at EPH. In 2022, 100% of funds raised supported the upgrade and expansion of the Outpatient Infusion Clinic. Services include chemotherapy and other medications administered intravenously.

#### UPGRADES TO THE EPH OUTPATIENT INFUSION CLINIC INCLUDE:

- Increasing the Number of Infusion Stations from Five to Eight.
- Funding Partition Curtains for Each Infusion Station to Increase Patient Privacy.
- Providing Medical-Grade Tables for Each Station for Use by Patients and Infusion Technicians.

- Providing a Padded Guest Chair for Each Station.
- Providing an iPad with Headphones for Each Station for Patient Use.

#### **EPH Sports Medicine Academy**

Each year, EPH's Orthopedic & Sports Medicine Surgeon, Dr. Aaron Florence, hosts a Sports Medicine Academy for local high school students. This event is a daylong simulation of treating sports injuries, touring the hospital, and meeting with different medical professionals to discuss career paths.
